Subject: Amending the constitution

PROPOSAL 1

That section 1 of article 25 of the amendments to the Constitution be amended to read as follows:

SEC. 1. At any session of the General Assembly of this state the Senate may, by a vote of a majority of its members, make Proposals of Amendment to the constitution of the state, which Proposals of Amendment, if concurred in by a majority of the members of the House of Representatives, shall be entered on the journals of the two houses, and referred to the General Assembly then next to be chosen, and be published in the principal newspapers of the state; and if two-thirds of the members of the Senate and of the House of Representatives of the next following General Assembly shall respectively concur in the same Proposals of Amendment, or any of them, it shall be the duty of the General Assembly to submit the Proposals of Amendment so concurred in to a direct vote of the freemen of the state; and such of said Proposals of Amendment as shall receive a majority of the votes of the freemen voting thereon shall become a part of the Constitution of this state.
